Sport Leadership Grants and Scholarships for Women

Minister for Sport Senator Kate Lundy and the Minister for the Status of Women Julie Collins

announced the opening of the 2012-13 grant round on International Women’s Day to highlight the contribution of women in sport. Applications will close at midnight on Friday 27 April 2012. To apply for a grant or scholarship, applicants must be supported by a sporting organisation affiliated with a national sporting organisation recognised by the ASC.

Under the Sport Leadership Grants and Scholarships for Women program grants of up to \$5,000 for individuals and \$10,000 for organisations are available to assist women to undertake accredited sport leadership training in the areas of coaching, officiating, governance, administration and management and communications, media and marketing. Sport leadership pathway scholarships of up to \$10,000 per annum for three years are also available.

Local Sporting Champions

The Local Sporting Champions program currently provides financial support for young sportsmen and women participating in state or national level sporting championships and national school sport championships.

Commencing 1 March 2012 the eligibility criteria for Local Sporting Champions will be enhanced to allow more sportsmen and women to apply. Competitions eligible for funding under the Local Sporting Champions program will be expanded to include:

- *State School Sport Championships*, endorsed by the relevant School Sport Australia Member body, and
- *international competitions*, for members of an official Australian team, endorsed by the relevant Australian Sports Commission recognised national sporting organisation or School Sport Australia.

Grants will continue to be \$500 for individuals and \$3000 for teams (including international competitions). Applicants are eligible to receive one grant (individual grant or as a member of a team grant) per allocation year (1 March - 28 February).

COACHING REPORT

Christmas and the New Year is always a busy time, and RDAA is no exception! 2012 has brought some new changes for Coaches. The first is the new Coach Registration process. Most coaches Australia-wide have jumped on board and sent us their forms, which we have been busy processing and we have sent out their Coach Accreditation cards for 2012. If any Coaches have not received a form, it can be downloaded from the Coaches Portal. This will keep Coaches details up to date and be easier to re-accredit on a yearly basis rather than every 4 years. It also brings us in line with other equestrian organisations who re-accredit their coaches every year.

NATIONAL COACHING WORKSHOP 30 June – 2 July

There are two big events planned for this year, the first being the National Coaches Workshop in Geelong, Victoria. There is a jam-packed program with the focus being on disabilities. The keynote speaker on Saturday night is Meg Wade, a top endurance rider from Victoria who suffered an acquired brain injury and began riding again with RDA. Her story was featured on Landline last year. The Workshop is open to all Coaches and interested volunteers. Details have been sent to States and are also available on the Coaches Portal.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS 3 – 5 OCTOBER

The National Championships have returned, with the focus being away from elite dressage to one of participation at all levels in all of the RDA disciplines. We hope that all States will be represented and that the event will be a big success! We are now calling for expressions of interest (details on the Coaches Portal)

COACHING SYLLABUS

Almost all of the new Coaching Syllabus has finished being printed, so we are now taking orders from States, Centres and individuals. If individuals wish to train in a particular discipline, they must go through the process of completing an Application to Train Form (available on the Coaches Portal or from your State Coaching Coordinator) which must be sent to your State Coaching Coordinator first who will then forward your syllabus order to us.

I hope that 2012 brings with it a year of moving forward to a bigger and brighter future for RDA across Australia!
