VICTORIAN BUSHFIRE DISASTER

In the last few days, all us will have been touched by the appalling disaster that has unfolded with the bushfires in Victoria. At the time of writing, we understand that no RDA centres in Victoria have been directly impacted by the disaster. However, many volunteers and friends of RDA will have suffered losses and as the National Body, we would like to express our deepest condolences and prayers for all those that have been affected.

RDAA has been able to offer some assistance to those affected. Dover Park at Diggers Rest, VIC, has been made available as an emergency refuge for horses that have been displaced in the disaster.

NATIONAL COACHING & SAFETY COUNCIL MEETING
